## CURRICULUM—What your child will be learning

## English

We will be reading a range of texts from different authors. These will include, 'The Lost Happy Endings' and the 'The Tear Thief' by Carol Ann Duffy, 'The Whale' by Vita Murrow and 'Leon and the Place Between' by Angela McAllister.

We will be using these texts to explore vocabulary and write stories in the style of the books. We will also link our writing with our theme to produce non-chronological texts about The Beatles.

#### Maths

We will be learning to tell the time, fractions, shape, length and perimeter and mass and capacity.

#### **Religious Education**

We will be learning about Sikhism and gaining an understanding of this religion.

#### **Physical Education**

Due to having two weeks swimming every afternoon at the beginning of the term, children have gained the opportunity to build on their prior skills from swimming earlier in the year. We will also be doing athletics, rounders and cricket as part of our outdoor PE sessions.

#### Science

Our science units for the summer term are 'Plants' and 'Light', where we will carry out investigations and gain a deeper knowledge of the topics. **PSHE & British Values** 

We will be looking at our rights and responsibilities, how to take care of the environment and the role that money plays in our lives.

Our theme in Summer is '**The Beatles'**. When working as historians the children will be looking at the impact the Beatles had on Liverpool and the local area. Children will consider how they made Liverpool a popular destination with tourists from around the world. When working as geographers children will be looking at Wirral and its surrounding counties. They will then be using their fieldwork skills to compare Wallasey to Liverpool. When working as musicians the children will be writing their own song to a Beatles track and record it in a real recording studio. Children will be listening to a selection of Beatles music and singing along and playing instruments.
