









If you are on packed lunch normally the charge for a school dinner is £2.30 and you will need to pay this on the parent pay app. If you are normally packed lunch **BUT** are entitled to free school meals then you need to fill in the forms online to be able to have the dinner for free. Ask at the school office if you need help with this.

ONLINE SAFETY

Please find below a list of apps and the recommended age for their usage. The age guidelines are there for a reason for these apps. There is the potential for harm on a number of different levels. Children need a certain level of maturity and knowledge to know how to safely use these apps. There is the potential for strangers to exploit them and for the child to get themselves into trouble due to inappropriate use.

Parents and carers should use the parental restrictions available and monitor their child's use of apps and social media. It is extremely difficult for school to sort out difficulties that arise out of school hours using social media, when children are using apps they should not have access to due to their age.
