CURRICULUM—What your child will be learning

English

We will be learning the story 'The Something' by Rebecca Cobb. The children will also be exposed to lots of other stories, including 'Elmer' and 'Owl Babies'.

Reading

All children will be given a 'reading for pleasure' book to take home with them once they start school full time. This is a book for you to enjoy with your child and read to them. They will get their own reading book as they progress with Read Write Inc.

Maths

Developing a strong grounding in number is essential so that all children develop the necessary building blocks to excel mathematically. Children should be able to count confidently, develop a deep understanding of the numbers to 10, the relationships between them and the patterns within those numbers. By providing frequent and varied opportunities to build and apply this understanding.

Creative development

Children have continuous access to a creative area where they can use their imagination and make some fabulous art work. We will be using the items we find on our autumn walk to create a leaf animal.

Physical Development

We will be focusing on handwriting and using the correct pencil grip. We will practise using different tools such as scissors, pencils, glue spreaders and tape correctly. As well as learning new skills at forest school.

Understanding of the world

We will be looking at the season autumn and taking a walk to our local park to spot what changes we can see from summer-autumn. The children will collect leaves/conkers/pine cones and create their own 'leaf animal' when we get back to school.

PSE

We will discuss school rules, why we have them and how to keep them. Alongside introducing Jigsaw Jennie in our Jigsaw lessons.
