As you can see reading is our lowest score. We have had our reading curriculum audited twice this year by two different external inspectors and each time our curriculum and teaching of it came out as a strength. Our school development for September will have a spotlight on 'Reading for Pleasure', getting children excited about reading and wanting to read for pleasure at home. To be successful in a reading test in Year 6 a child needs not only the skills for answering the question (which we give them in school) but needs to have read widely and often. They need to be reading different authors, different genre types to have picked up the wide range of vocabulary through the reading, to be successful.

We know books can be expensive and that our local library closed. This is why we have invested tens of thousands of pounds in books for our school library and class book shelves, Every child is welcome to borrow our books and return them when finished.

Encourage your children to read as many books as they can over the summer. They can take part in the National Reading challenge.

PARENT CARER BEHAVIOUR ON SCHOOL PROPERTY

As a school we want as much interaction with our families as possible as we very much want to be a school for our whole community. We want to be as open as possible for you all. Sadly, recently we have had adults behaving inappropriately in front of children, other parents and staff. This has been in the form of fighting, general swearing, letting children on the adventure playground after school, irresponsible parking and driving.

We do not want to limit any interactions but we MUST make our school as safe, calm, friendly and caring as possible for ALL of our children, families and staff. Therefore, we will not tolerate parents fighting, swearing in front of the children and staff and not following measures we have put in place to keep our children safe including the respect line, and use of adventure playground.

We can revoke an adults right to be on our school grounds, this includes at pick up and drop off and for wider school events such as Christmas shows and summer fairs. If we feel that behaviour is inappropriate then the Executive Headteacher will review that adults situation and then communicate the outcome with them accordingly. This is not something we want to do however will we do whatever we need to to make our school is the best environment it can be. Thank you for your support moving forward.
