PARENTS' EVENING

A little reminder that it is parents evening next week. ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

Next week the attendance of every child will be reviewed. The attendance manager will be looking at the number of sessions missed since September rather than the percentage attendance. Up to 10 unauthorised sessions could lead to a fine. Each school day is two sessions (morning and afternoon). This means that five full days of unauthorised absence could lead to a fine being issued by the local authority. Absences can be authorised by providing the following evidence:

Schools can accept the following as medical evidence:

- GP certificate
- Letter from health professional
- Appointment card / letter (dated)
- Prescription / Medication in the name of the child
- Text message from GP or NHS confirming an appointment
- Care of the chemist date stamped slip to show medical advice has been sought

Our school motto is Aiming High Together and our core values are respect, resilience, happiness and responsibility. We have high expectations of ourselves in the provision we give to all of our learners. We strive for excellence in all areas of school life and have high expectations for all.

We have high expectations of each and every child achieving their very best.

We have high expectations for attendance - each child in school on time every day.

We have high expectations of learning behaviours allowing every child the opportunity to do their best.

We have high expectations in the wearing of school uniform and PE kit - each and every child part of our team.

Last academic year standards slipped with school uniform particularly on PE days with children just wearing their own clothes or the wrong colour uniform. We want each and every child to feel part of Somerville and that means wearing our uniform, our kit. We don't want children to feel like they are the odd one out in their class or even the entire school because they are wearing something different. We don't want children to feel inadequate because they can't ever afford the really expensive trainers or tracksuits. We don't want parents to feel the pressure of having to buy expensive trainers or tracksuits because their child has seen someone else in their class wear them. It is for these reasons we are tightening up on school uniform again in, line with other schools across Wirral. It is an expectation that children will wear it for the above reasons. We do understand that that uniform can be expensive which is why we have a stock of brand new kits in school. If a child does come to school in clothing that is not school uniform or school PE kit we will lend them one of ours for the school day so they look part of our school and there is no pressure on them or other children. If finances are difficult and you are struggling to purchase the correct kit please speak to Miss Crampton or Mrs Parry via the school office.

White polo shirt and or white school shirt with school tie Navy blue cardigan or v neck jumper with school logo Black shoes with no heel or PLAIN black trainers - no colours

School PE Kit: Plain black jogging bottoms or leggings or plain navy school shorts

White polo shirt

Navy blue sweatshirt with school logo

Plain black trainers

NO tracksuits

The children have told us they like wearing trainers for lunchtimes to play basketball and football. Therefore, this year we feel it is time to allow plain black trainers alongside school shoes with the school uniform, if that is more helpful for the children and sometimes two pairs of shoes can be expensive, particularly if you have more than one child in school.
