It has been lovely meeting with so many of you already. Just to let everyone know, once pathway paperwork is given to school, we send it off to the 0-19 team at the NHS. We, as a school, can not diagnose any condition.



It is the NHS that makes decisions and referrals to paediatricians and other specialists. We understand the frustrations this can cause but it is out of our hands once we have submitted paperwork. At this point the NHS 0-19 team should communicate directly with yourselves. If at any time you would like to chase where you are up to in the system and on the waiting lists you can do this directly with them, their number is 0151 604 7501. The last information school received, there was at least a 90 week waiting list, this is almost two years. As a school we are as frustrated by this situation as you are.

The attendance of every child has been reviewed. Letters and requests for Stage 1 panel meetings have gone out. CHANGES TO PAYMENTS FOR OTIS AND BREAKFAST CLUB

We are introducing a new payment scheme for Otis Breakfast and After School Club. Starting from 4th November 2024, all places will need to be booked and paid for in advance via our new iPAL booking system. The system will allow you to book places for the coming week until 6pm on the Sunday evening. We will send further information closer to the time to help you sign up for this new system.

As you may know, we have not increased the cost of our clubs for many years, and we are committed to continuing to offer wrap-around care at an affordable rate. The new system will ensure that all places are prepaid, which will help us keep the club's costs as low as possible.

The daily register will be taken through this new booking system, so a place will only be available for your child if it has been booked via iPAL.
