NEURODIVERSITY INFORMATION FROM MRS SPEIGHT



ADHD, ASD, Dyspraxia and Dyslexia all fall within the spectrum of "Neurodiversity", and although teachers adapt their teaching to cater for all children, there are times when experts in these areas can advise further. As the class teacher knows the children best, they are the people who you should speak to first, before you and them jointly submit paperwork to the NHS 0-19 team. Unfortunately, The Wirral LA do not do a full dyspraxia or dyslexia diagnosis and this is something that would need to be done independently through a private consultant.

CONDUCT ON SCHOOL SITE
