#### **COLD SEASON**

The vast majority of children will catch a cold or even several over the winter months. Children can still come to school with a cold, sniffles, coughs, tiredness. Only if they are really unwell and unable to work should they stay off school. School can administer liquid paracetamol throughout the day, if you fill in the forms, if you feel they need it and it would make them comfortable enough to come to school. Catching colds is a normal part of childhood and children manage very well once they are in school. School will contact you if your child becomes too unwell to attend.



## **WINTER COATS**

Just a reminder that all children should be in their winter coats as they are outside at break times and lunchtimes. They can also be out in light drizzle for fresh air. They therefore need to be prepared for this weather. In school we do have a selection of good winter coats for children. 
#### SENDCO SPOTLIGHT



As previously mentioned on a newsletter, we use 'adaptive teaching' which means we adapt our teaching to meet individual's needs. At Somerville, we pride ourselves on knowing our children. We are proactive in recognising their differences and potential barriers. We achieve this through the everyday strong, trusting relationships built between adult and child.

The Wirral's Local Offer is a tiered approach:





We understand that at times, in addition to 'adapting' our teaching (Tier 1), some children will need a little bit extra (Tier 2).

All schools on the Wirral follow 'The **Graduated Approach'** which is a way that schools help children who need extra support with their learning (Tier 2). It's a system that helps teachers find out what a child needs and then give the right kind of help.

This system has **four steps** that happen over and over again:

- 1. **Assess** Find out what the child needs help with.
- 2. Plan Make a plan for how to give that help.
- **3. Do** Put the plan into action and give the help.
- **4. Review** Check to see if the help is working, and see if any changes need to be made.

The idea is that this is not a one-time thing. As children grow and change, the school keeps checking in and updating the plan to make sure they're getting the best support possible.

#### **USE OF SOCIAL MEDIA**

This academic year we have been made aware of incidents where parents are talking about staff on social media. Some of the comments have been, at times ,unpleasant, unjustified and untrue.

If any of our families have an issue or a query about their child's education then Facebook is not the place where that can be solved for you or for you to get the information, help or support that you need. If something does crop up then we urge you to contact school at the earliest opportunity rather than going straight to social media.

If you have an initial concern contact your child's class teacher.

If you feel you need further support contact you child's band leader.

If you have not been able to resolve the situation at this point then you should contact the Assistant Headteachers for your child's key stage.

If you feel there has been an escalation or further support is required then contact Deputy Headteacher or Headteacher.

The information below is taken from the National Education Union Website (NEU). It outlines what Cyber bullying is and how schools should respond to it to protect their staff.

#### School Duty

'It is important that the school community is aware that cyberbullying will be dealt with as seriously as face-to-face bullying, regardless of whether the bullying is physically perpetrated on the school site. DfE guidance on cyberbullying states: Schools should also make clear that it is not acceptable for pupils, parents or colleagues to denigrate and bully school staff via social media in the same way that it is unacceptable to do so face to face.'

School can also send any information to the Borough Solicitor if they feel action needs to be taken to protect staff from bullying and harassment online.
