# **READING AT SOMERVILLE**

We often include articles in our newsletters about how we positively advocate for children to read often and widely outside of the school day. There has been **MUCH** research done about the positive immediate impacts of being read to as a young child and reading from when you can first read and throughout your school life. We have included some screenshots from the Book Trust website which summarises the benefits of

reading which are many and great. Reading outside of school will have a profound, positive impact on each and every child who does this. We have included a link to the book trust website which you can copy and paste into your browser. If we have sold reading enough to you, the research available here will definitely do this.

Many of our children tell us they spend hours, and hours watching YouTube and Playing games such as fortnight. They are tired when they come to school because their sleep pattern is disrupted because they have been on their tech. Encourage your child to read for at least half an hour of this time, each day, will have a range of benefits including increased wellbeing, increased academic success, a successful future.

# SENDCO SPOTLIGHT



This is just a reminder of the procedure to follow if you have any Special Needs concern around your child. The class teachers are your first port of call if you have any concerns as they know your child best and know what progress your child is making across all of the curriculum areas. The teachers also know what additional support is in place for your child and how that is going. Anyone with a child on the SEND register will be informed

and individual plans will be shared on EDU KEY termly. All queries should go to the class teacher first before the SENDCO is contacted. We do have parents evening in February. If you do have a SEND query about your child, this is the best opportunity to raise it with your child's class teacher.

### **RECEPTION MYSTERY READER**

In reception it is important we try to hook the children into reading. One of the initiatives we do that the children absolutely love is MYSTERY READER. Mystery reader is when a family member comes in to school on a Friday afternoon fort 20 minutes to read a picture book to the class. Children love to see their grown up come in and read. Each week the children are excited to see who is going to come



in and read to them. The reader remain 'top secret' until they arrive. The teacher will give small clues throughout the day until the mystery reader arrives. We need as many reception grown ups to sign up as possible to make sure this continues to get the children excited about story time. If you would be willing to share 20 minutes of your time, one week over this term, please speak to either Mrs Wilson or Miss Murray to sign yourself up. Thank you to all in advance.
